



4. KAZHCHA: ART AND CRAFT EXIHIBITION

7. PACHAVIRAL - SEMINAR ON ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES


DATE: 18 FEBRUARY 2020




9. AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON PROTECTING ENVIRONMENT




12. POETRY DAY - A POETRY COMPETITION


DAY: 13 MARCH 2021






13. **FORESTRY DAY**






16. WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY - 2022


