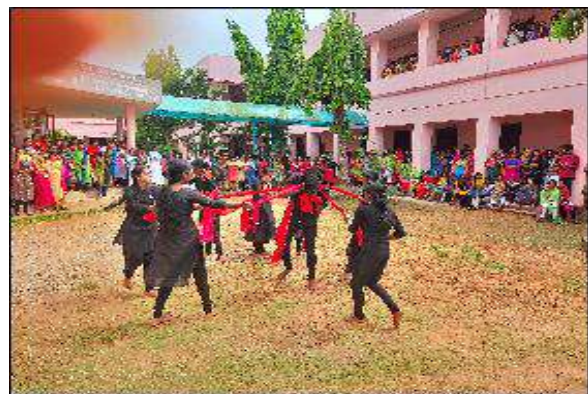

DAY 7: 31 December 2019

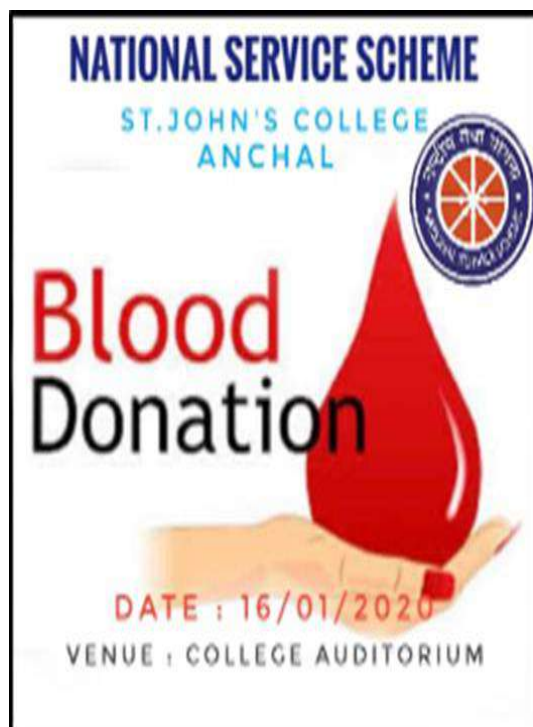
