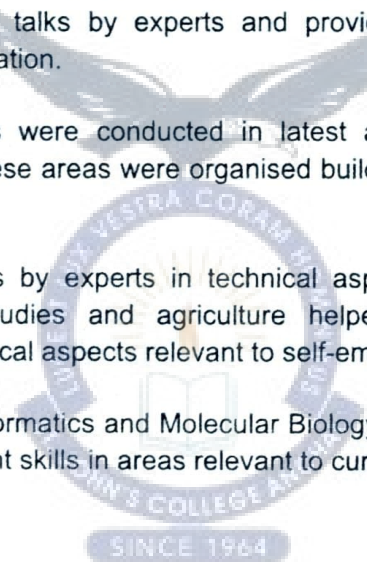





DEPARTMENT FEEDBACK: 2018 - 19

Department regularly collects the feedback from students on curriculum and syllabus every year, which are then compiled and consolidated at the college level.

- During the year 2018 - 19, we are adopted some modifications in the syllabus and that are discussed with the syllabus revision committee of the university with the addition of 15 days compulsory internship programme for Post Graduate students. The implementation part of the syllabus is evaluated using various parameters, such as, library facilities, laboratory facilities, ICT facilities, internal assessment, etc. The council entrusted the IQAC to look into the aspects that needed improvement and to suggest necessary corrective measures.
- Today, educators realize that computer literacy is an important part of a student's education. Integrating technology into a course curriculum when appropriate is proving to be valuable for enhancing and extending the learning experience for faculty and students.
- The department takes initiatives for testing the drinking water samples from various house and other institutions by the analysis of different environmental parameters in our laboratory, which is approved by the Kerala State Pollution Control Board.
- In this year the faculties published 9 research papers in various national and international journals.
- We had a well-equipped laboratory for the complete analysis of soil, water, effluents from factories and hospitals and microbiological analysis by using sophisticated instruments.
- At the end of the academic year we are intended to made an effective strategy to improve our teaching-learning process became more attractive and informative.
- In this academic year we conducted National Science Day, Wetland day and International Ozone day with one day workshop in association with KSCSTE Thiruvananthapuram.

- We have conducted National Seminar on Climate change impacts on Biodiversity, Environment and Management in association with DoECC, Govt. of Kerala and KSCSTE, Govt. of Kerala
- Recognitions received by the students Arunima R: Kerala University third rank in Environmental Science in 2018
- Protocol has been formulated to be develop the department as a research centre in Environmental Science including a full fledged laboratory for commercial analysis of environmental samples.

A full day was spent with the inmates of the old age home and all teachers and students had lunch too along with the inmates. This visit helped a lot in awakening the social awareness amongst the students,



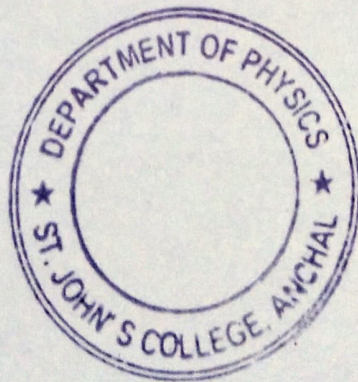

- The Department has organised a one day seminar on “Challenges to Secularism in Indian Democracy on 11 March 2019 in association with Indian Institute of Public Administration (Kerala Regional Branch).
- On 12th March 2019, another seminar on the aforesaid title was organised in association with the Institute of Parliamentary Affairs, Government of Kerala.
- The Department, in collaboration with Higher Secondary Directorate and the Directorate of Collegiate Education, has organised a ten day residential training programme for Higher Secondary Teachers from all over Kerala during November 2018.
- Our department understands the importance of learning from students’ own experience. From this year onwards, we encourage the BA students to conduct surveys within the college for their degree project. The Department will provide opportunities for students to analyze the survey data and publish the report. We really hope that our survey would provide students insights regarding ‘political science in action’.
- The Department has took a conscious decision to promote empirical research in politics and administration. We promote survey-based student dissertations exploring specific administrative and political problems in empirical contexts. In addition to training various quantitative and qualitative research methods, the department provide opportunities for students to analyze the empirical data and link it with relevant theoretical frameworks.
- The department face serious space constraints and there is an urgent necessity to extend and renovate the existing building. While the present BA classrooms need moderate renovation, an extra PG Classroom is necessary to meet the teaching requirements. Since the department intends to upgrade itself as a research centre in the near future, an equipped building is a real necessity.
