EVALUATION

There shall be Continuous Evaluation (CE) and End Semester Evaluation (ESE) for each course. CE is based on specific components viz., assignments, seminars and tests. The CE shall be for 20 marks and ESE shall be for 80 marks. The marks of each component of CE shall be: Assignments/Seminar- 10 and Test Papers - 10 for 2020 admission onwards, and attendance -5, Assignments/Seminar - 5 and test papers 10 for 2018, 2019 admission. A minimum of 35% marks shall be required for passing a course with a separate minimum of 35% for ESE. Those who fail to secure a pass minimum of 35% for a course will have one chance to improve CE marks for the course.

WORKING DAYS AND CLASS HOURS

The college works under the full day system with two sessions i.e., morning session of three consecutive hours divided into three periods and an afternoon session of two consecutive hours divided into two periods. In between there is a noon interval of one hour from 12.30 p.m. The morning session begins at 9.30 a.m. Remedial teaching and tutor-ward interaction will be carried for out one hour from 8.30 a.m. or 3.30 pm. The afternoon session commences at 1.30 p.m. and ends by 3.30 p.m.

The beginning of the morning session before the commencement of classes, is marked by a warning bell; then the students should go into their respective classes and occupy their seats. Every day the classes begin with a two minute prayer. All are requested to stand still on hearing the prayer bell.

ATTENDANCE

1. The Teacher marks attendance at the beginning of each period.
2. A student who is not in the class when attendance is taken shall be marked absent.
3. Attendance may be given to the late comers up to 15 minutes in the first hour, at the discretion of the teacher.
4. At the end of each month/semester each student may check his/her attendance, which will be displayed on the notice board or from the website of the college.
5. Attendance may be given to the absentees who attend any programme with the written permission from the teacher concerned and on production of participation certificate.
6. Students who secure a minimum of 75% attendance in the aggregate for all the Courses of a semester taken together alone will be allowed to register for the End Semester Evaluation. Others have to repeat the semester along with the next batch, unless they could make up the shortage of attendance through condonation.
7. Award of grade for attendance in CE is for practicals only.

8. Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 10 days in a semester subject to a maximum of two times during the whole period of a Degree Programme shall be granted by the University on valid grounds.
9. This condonation shall not be considered for awarding marks for CE in practicals. Benefits of attendance for a maximum of 10 days in a semester shall be granted to students who participate/ attend University Union activities, meetings of the University Bodies and Extra Curricular Activities, on production of participation/ attendance certificate by the University Authorities/Principals as the case may be. But in such cases, award of marks for CE will be considered.
10. A student who happens to be absent on any ground should submit a leave letter counter signed by the parent / guardian sufficiently in advance or on the joining day with supporting documents.

34. GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

35. GRIEVANCES RELATING TO SEXUAL HARASSMENT / INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE

Anyone with a genuine grievance relating to sexual harassment may lodge their complaint, written or oral, with or without necessary documents, if any, to the Chairman (the Principal) or any of the members of this Committee. After the receipt of the application/complaint of the aggrieved, the Chairman shall fix the date, time, and venue of the meeting after having a discussion with the members. The meeting shall be scheduled within ten days of receipt of the application. All relevant papers shall be circulated as hard/soft copy to all the members on or before the date of the meeting. After fixing the date of the meeting, a hard copy of the notice must be sent to the applicant to be present in the meeting and convey his or her grievances before the Committee. In case of a minor student (applicant), the student may be accompanied by his or her parents/guardian. The brief facts, evidences, and the final recommendations by the Committee members shall be recorded in the format of minutes of the meeting. The minutes shall be circulated to all the members of the Grievance Committee for their signature. The decision of the Grievance Committee shall be communicated in writing to the applicant at the earliest. Dr Ronie Thomas (Convenor), Ms Bainy George, Dr Jency Roshan F., Mr Jerry C. Jacson, Ms Nisha Thomas, and Fr Shoji Varghese are the other members of the Committee.

36. HOUSE ACTIVITIES
